
# **July 2020**

#### CSC SNOW BALL NOVEMBER 14, 2020

The Connecticut Ski Council's only fundraiser, The Snow Ball, is scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 14 at the Hartford/Windsor Marriott in Windsor, CT. The theme of this year's event is "**The Mountains Are Calling and I Must Go**". Due to uncertainties we all face due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Council is currently discussing whether it is feasible to go ahead with the event as usual. ### DSC Lodge Update

As the club enters the 2020-2021 ski season, there are many unknowns we are all facing. Will COVID-19 have a Wave 2 resurgence in New England ? Will the mountains stay open ? The Board has evaluated options with the lodge owners along with the the following key considerations. (1) The club had an issue with The Maples lodge in 2019-2020 season that prevented the lodge from being utilized for a period of time. (2) The lodge has operated at a significant loss for several years, even in good snow years. (3) There is significant uncertainty in the upcoming ski season.

After several discussions and options evaluated, the board voted not to renew the lease on the Maples lodge for 2020-2021 season in the best interest of the club membership. We know that some of you will be unhappy with this decision, however is the best determination for the club overall at this point in time. We will be looking at lodge options for the 2021-2022 ski season. We will take the survey inputs, as well as any direct inputs you want to share and use this to help guide the options for the return of a DSC lodge for the membership.


If anyone would like to be on the Lodge Committee to work on future options, please let any Board member know.
